- 1. Answer all items in (a) and (b). Each item carries one (1) mark.
 - (a) Provide short answers for items (i) -(x)

 - (ii) 1 Samuel 1:1-8 tells us about Elkanah and his family. Mention the names of his two wives and their situations.

 - (iv) Balak the son of Zippor, who was king of Moab at that time, sent messengers to Balaam to call him to come and curse the people who came out of Egypt. (Numbers 22:5). Why did he ask Balaam to curse them?
 - (v) According to Joshua 4:1-24, why did the Israelites quarrel with the Reubenites, Gadites and the half-tribe of Manasseh over the altar which they built?
